Clinical verification: EBM in patient's perspective

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The state of clinical evidence

Hahn R. (2013): "To conclude that homeopathy lacks clinical effect, more than 90% of the available clinical trials had to be disregarded.

Alternatively, flawed statistical methods had to be applied."

In fact, only a combination of selection and flawed statistics can lead to this conclusion.

Placebo – homeopathy - conventional

Homeopathy = placebo (exact binomial chance): p<10 exp-12

Discarding >90% of the evidence

Shang/Egger: (Lancet 2005)

"Weak evidence for homeopathic remedies, but strong evidence for conventional medicines":

Selection: <u>8</u> homeopathy (OR 0.88, 95%CI 0.65-1.19) versus <u>6</u> conventional (OR 0.58, 95% CI 0.35-0.85) trials.

Refused to give details about conclusive subgroup.

"This was a careful **comparison** between homeopathy and **matched** conventional trials"

"Careful comparison"(?)

Homeopathy

- 1. <u>Diarrhoea</u>
- 2. <u>Influenza treatment</u>
- 3. Influenza prevention
- 4. Warts
- 5. Weight loss
- 6. Muscle soreness
- 7. Head pain
- 8. Sinusitis

Not included: Hay-fever (Reilly)

Conventional medicine

- 1. <u>Diarrhoea</u>
- 2. <u>Influenza treatment</u>
- 3. Influenza treatment
- 4. Stroke
- 5. Post-operative infection
- 6. Hay-fever

Selection, flawed statistics and fraud

- Undisclosed, incomparable, heterogeneous subsets
- Outcome depended on 1 trial (muscle soreness)
- Cut-off for 'larger'; above median size rendered statistically significant effect of homeopathy
- Changed quality criteria excluding Reilly's trial on hay-fever (strong positive effect).

The conclusions on the effectiveness of homeopathy highly depend on the set of analyzed trials

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Who needs what EBM in homeopathy?

Sharples 2003: 88% of patients complaints lasted >2 years.

Witt, 2004: 103 practices, 3.981 patients:

Complaints in adults 10.3 years, in children 4,3 years.


Homeopathy worked after conventional medicine failed (>200 million patients worldwide).

Different mechanism of action, different clinical research

Homeopathy does not work like conventional medicines. Homeopathic medicines should fit the person, not only the condition (personalised medicine).

Prognostic factors and EBM

Diagnosis pneumonia

Symptoms/signs:		chance
•	Cough	5%
•	Fever	10%
•	Rapid breathing	25%
•	Shortness of breath	35%
•	Chest pain on cough	50%
•	Examination / CRP	80%

Chance Belladonna will work (homeopathy)

Symptoms/sings:	chance:
 Cough 	5%
 Fever with delirium 	20%
 Rapid breathing 	35%
 Head pain with cough 	50%
 Grinding teeth in sleep 	75%

Personalised diagnosis/prognosis based on expert opinion, consensus. Also on research.

Experience validated by research

Dutch prognostic factor research in 10 practices, 4094 patients. Prognostic factor: 'Grinding teeth during sleep'.

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Prevalence 'Grinding teeth during sleep' in the whole population = 219/4094 = 5.2%.
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'Grinding teeth during sleep' in the population responding well to *Belladonna* = 6/21 = 28.6%.

'Grinding teeth during sleep' occurs more frequently in patients responding well to Belladonna. Likelihood Ratio >1.

Algorithm for homeopathy

LR (Likelihood Ratio) = prevalence in target (e.g. *Belladonna*) population prevalence remainder population

LR (Belladonna | grinding teeth) = 28.6/5.2 = 5.5

Bayes' Theorem:

Posterior odds = LR * prior odds

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Verified Gelsemium symptoms

Rutten et al: 13 Patients responding well to Gelsemium. Verified symptoms:

- Diarrhoea before exams, etc.:
 LR = 14.5 (95% CI 9.2 to 22.8)
- Recurrent herpes of lips:
 LR = 3.1 (95% CI 0.86 to 11.5)

Van Wassenhoven: 48 Patients responding well to Gelsemium. Verified symptoms:

- Persistent thoughts
- Ailments from grief
- Anxiety in stomach
- Hay fever
- Anxiety about the future

Conclusion

- Proof for homeopathy is not inferior to proof for conventional medicine.
- If conventional medicines fail homeopathy is a rational solution for hundreds of millions of patients.
- From patient's perspective prognostic factor research is a better option.
